Formulating a Thesis

- A thesis is a statement of the main idea of an essay or paper. It proposes an opinion that the rest of the paper proves. In school essays and other academic work, the thesis is usually stated in the opening paragraph, and the topic sentence of each paragraph that follows expands upon or supports the thesis.
- A thesis should be broad enough to include all the subtopics, information, or arguments presented in the essay. Statistics and other narrow statements of fact do not allow enough scope for opinion.

EXAMPLE: **Too Narrow:** Canada has participated in over seventy peacekeeping operations overseas.

However, a thesis should also be narrow enough to enable you to cover it thoroughly in the space available. That is why you should avoid using extreme words such as <u>all</u>, <u>never</u>, or <u>always</u> in your thesis. Such statements are hard to back up.

EXAMPLES: **Too Broad:** Canadian Peacekeepers are the best in the world.

- A **thesis** should be broad enough to include all the subtopics, information, or arguments in the essay. However, it should be narrow enough to allow you to deal with it thoroughly in the space available.
- Avoid using extreme terms such as <u>all, never</u>, and <u>always</u> in a thesis, unless you are sure you can back up what you are saying.

EXAMPLE: **Too broad:** All stress research today owes its existence to the work of Hans Selve.

(It would be almost impossible to prove such a general

statement.)

Too narrow: Hans Selye was the first to coin the term "stress" in

relation to human beings.

(This is an interesting fact, but it does not leave much room for the writer to expand upon it.)
